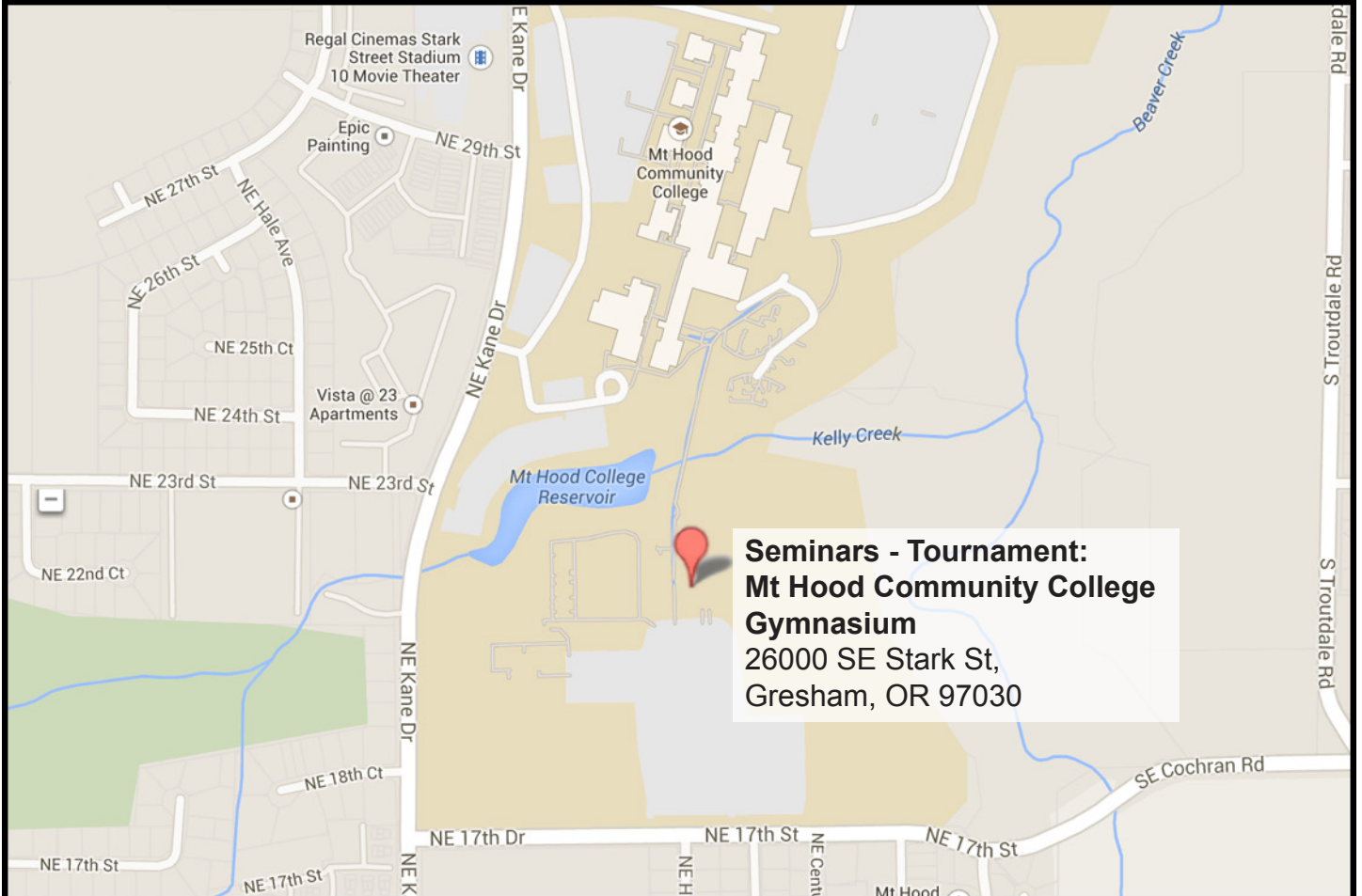
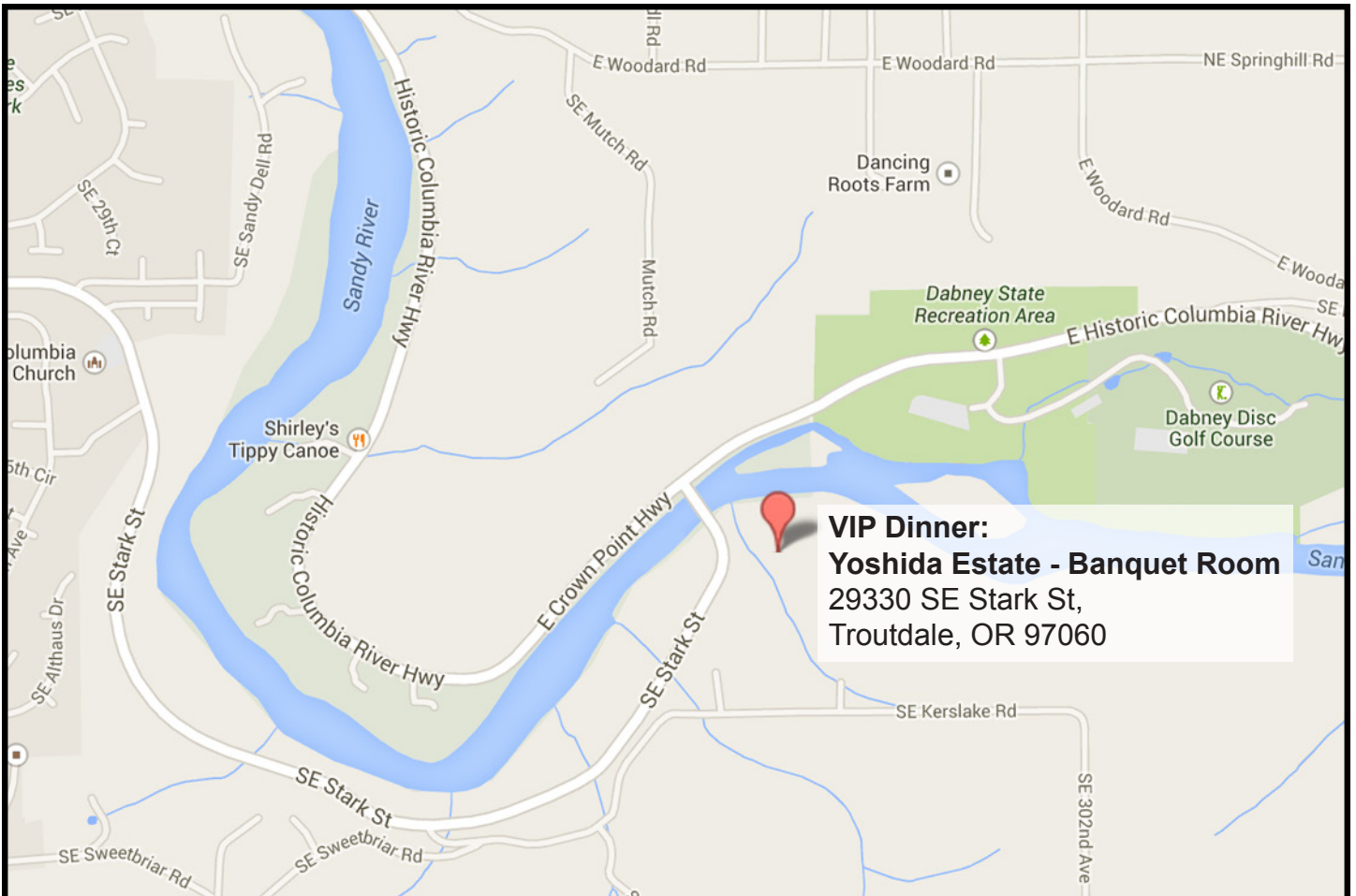

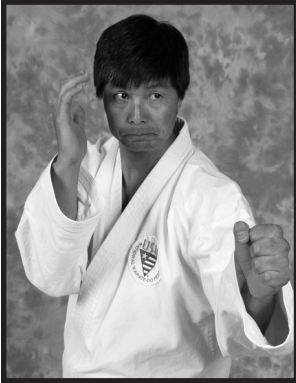

SENSEI HIDEHARU IGAKI

Hideharu Igaki Sensei is the former Head Coach for the USA Karate National Team, USOC Karate Coach of the Year and National Grassroots Coach's Director. Currently a lead instructor at JKFNW Hombu Dojo, Hillsboro, OR. His black belt is in Fujitani-Ha Shito-Ryu Meibu-Kai and Instructors license in Tenshin-Ko-Ryu Kenpo. He also was a professional kick boxer in Japan before moving to the U.S. in 1979. He and his wife, Jan, also create beautiful Hikidashi clay work together.



SENSEI SUZUKO OKAMURA-HAMASAKI

A Goju-ryu practitioner, the first Women's World Kata Champion Suzuko Okamura-Hamasaki will be teaching a kata seminar. She has practiced Karate-Do continuously for almost half a century. Beginning in Japan when she was six years old, under the tutelage of her father, Mitsuyasu Okamura, Hamasaki was one of the few women to engage in karate, a martial art dominated by men. As a young adult, she entered major competitions, most notably placing first in the 5th World Karate Championships in Madrid, Spain (1980), the 1st World Games in Santa Clara, Calif., and the 35th All Japan Sports Championships in Shiga, Japan (1981). Since arriving in the United States in the early 1980s, Hamasaki has taught karate, lectured and published throughout the world on the subject. She currently sits on the board of directors of the Academy of Karate-Do in Japan. Her background and the experience of having been involved in Karate-Do as a student, competitor, teacher, lecturer and writer have given her insight into the way in which the martial arts of Japan, and Karate-Do in particular, is transmitted to and received by the public.



SENSEI KIYOHICO TOSA

Sensei Kiyohiko Tosa is the son of Shihan Kunihiko Tosa who founded Gensei Ryu Karate-do International Federation (GKIF) in 1962. Kiyohiko Tosa Sensei was on the Japan National Team (JKF), earning an Individual Bronze at the 4th Asian Championships and Team Gold at 5th Asian Championships, Japan's Team Kumite squad for 15th World Championships in Munich and travels around the world representing their organization. He is current Permanent Director and Vice-Secretary General and designated as successor for GKIF.

SHIHAN SHIN TSUKII

Vice-Chairman of Japan Karate-do Gojukai Association. Former National Team Coach for the Philippine National Karate Team. Tsukii Sensei now is the consultant of Adidas Budo Mart Japan (BMJ) as well as the commentator and consultant of Champ, the authorized video of the World Karate Federation (WKF) and Japan Karatedo Federation (JKF) and President of World Karate Academy. He is known as "Expert of the Match" with several training DVDs with Champ video and teaches seminars around Japan and the world.



SHIHAN TOSHIHIRO OSHIRO

Chief Instructor - Oshiro Dojo, San Mateo

Chief Instructor - Ryukyu Bujutsu Kenkyu Doyukai

Shihan Toshihiro Oshiro, Chief Instructor, has actively studied Okinawan martial arts for over forty years. He has been teaching in the United States since arriving here in 1979. He had the opportunity to learn karate and kobujutsu from many masters of Okinawan martial arts, including Sensei Shoshin Nagamine, Sensei Chogi Kishaba, Sensei Masao Shima, and Sensei Seigi Nakamura. Shihan Oshiro is considered a top authority on Ryukyu martial arts, and frequently travels nationally and internationally to teach Okinawan karate and kobudo. He has published numerous articles and interviews in martial arts publications in Japan, Europe and the U.S.
